

Honorable Body:

Last year, the Common Council passed a resolution to amend the engineering services during construction and construction oversight agreement with Greenman-Pedersen, Inc. for the Frederick B. Durkee Memorial Bridge Rehabilitation Project, providing funds to extend the bridge inspection for the second construction season through to the end of September 2014. Work proceeded beyond this time period until mid-January 2015 when severe cold temperatures precluded the contractor from completing the final work of steel painting and concrete sealing required. This work is slated to be finished this coming April when warmer weather permits. Existing funding dedicated to the project is in place to perform this work.

Accordingly, I respectfully request that the Common Council approve the enclosed supplemental agreement no. 4 for construction inspection and construction support to Greenman-Pedersen, Inc, 4950 Genesee Street, P.O. Box 165, Buffalo, NY 14225; in an amount not to exceed \$70,364.94; and authorize the Mayor to sign said agreement subject to review by the City Attorney.

Construction Inspection

Construction has extended beyond the original extension. As we have previously discussed GPI has on-site Construction Inspection costs beyond the current contract amount. The January invoice included \$45,988.31 for Construction Inspection Services provided from 9/20/2014 thru 12/26/2014. The invoice also included a one-time correction in the premium overtime overhead calculation. The overtime was previously calculated using the full 124% OH rate. However, premium overtime should receive a lower 15% (Burden only) rate. This results in a credit to the City of \$4,467.16.

The February 2015 invoice covering 12/27/14 through 1/23/15 added \$6,045.20 to the Construction Inspection Fee.

We are currently \$47,468.23 over the current budget.
