**Bulk debris should be placed to the curb no sooner than bulk week and no later than your scheduled garbage day.**

Bulk is collected on your scheduled garbage day. Debris placed at the curb after your scheduled pickup day may not be collected. Bulk debris placed at the curb outside of bulk week may result in a ticket & fine. Please keep bulk piles neat - box, bag & bundle. Debris from move-outs will not be picked up (strictly enforced).

**Do not place debris on or near bubblers or water boxes**

**Every week**, we will collect your garbage cart(s), your recycle cart(s), and two clear bags of lawn debris.

**Branches & brush** are collected during non-bulk weeks, typically on your garbage day.

**Tires** must be brought to the DPW during business hours for disposal for a fee (\$5-\$10 depending on the tire).



## ELECTRONICS

NYS prohibits curbside electronic disposal. E-waste can be dropped off at the DPW during business hours. Bring proof of residency and check in at arrival.



## 2024 HOLIDAY SCHEDULING

The DPW is closed on the below holidays. Sanitation services on or after a holiday will take place one day late during that week.

Common household items such as items containing refrigerant (refrigerators, ac units, dehumidifiers, etc), cleaners, chemicals & paint are managed through hazardous waste drop-off.

Unwanted pharmaceuticals are accepted at the NTPD drop box and at local pharmacies at no cost.

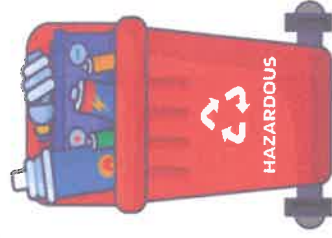

## RECYCLE GUIDELINES

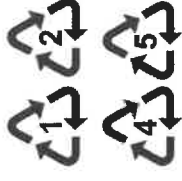
The best items to Recycle are...

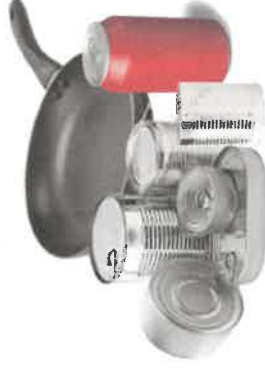

**When applicable - empty, rinse well & keep lids on.**

**"Wish-cycling"** is the act of adding to your recyclables cart without knowing if the item is recyclable, which can cause hazards at the recycle facility. Additionally, the cost to dispose of such items is over double that of items placed in the garbage cart - which falls onto the taxpayer. **When in doubt, throw it out!**

**Here are some unacceptable items that should not be placed in your recycling cart...**

Aerosol cans, animal waste, **batteries (of ANY kind)**, bubble wrap, coated fiber products (milk cartons, disposable cups), clothing, concrete/stone/bricks, diapers, ceramic cookware, **electronics (of ANY kind)**, food waste, garden hoses, hardcover books, hazardous waste (chemicals, gasoline, medical), household cleaners, loose particles (ash, shavings, etc), paint cans, propane tanks, plastic straws, plastic bags/film, styrofoam, unacceptable glass (light bulbs, plate glass, mirrors), wood items, yard waste
