As you may be aware, the Greater Buffalo-Niagara Transportation Council (GBNRTC) and the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) have announced the availability of funding for pedestrian safety projects as identified in the New York State PSAP, June 2016. \$40 Million in federal Highway Safety Program funding is available across the state with \$4.72 Million designated for NYSDOT Region 5. The application deadline is March 9th, 2018.

Following a review of North Tonawanda's intersections and consultation with various City officials, we have identified twenty-five (25) intersections where pedestrian safety measures could be implemented. These locations were selected based on a number of factors including project feasibility, project need, and pedestrian safety concerns. The intersections that were of main focus were in the Main/Webster Streets corridor and the Payne Avenue corridor. A mix of signalized and uncontrolled intersections are included in this grant application. Under this grant program, safety projects selected will receive 100% financing with zero local matching funds.

As you are aware, it was announced in October 2017 that the City of North Tonawanda will be the recipient of \$2,500,000 from the New York State Smart Growth Community Fund. This program is intended to support Smart Growth public investments that make downtown communities more pedestrian friendly, accessible, attractive, and dynamic in order to attract new development, support existing businesses and services, and improve the quality of life for downtown residents. In December 2017, the City also received \$100,000 from the Canal Corporation and \$700,000 from NYSDOS to make improvements to Gateway Park and the Sweeney Canal Wall Docks.

Improvements to Gateway Park include the installation of a new bathroom/storage/harbor master facility, installation of new seating areas, and improvements to the electrical systems at the park.

To complete the Gateway Park Improvements Project, the City intends to procure the services of a professional engineering firm. This firm's responsibilities will include a public engagement process to solicit ideas and input for North Tonawanda's residents, design of the identified improvements, and implementation assistance through the construction and installation stages.

A request for proposals was issued in January 2018 and the City received six proposals from professional firms. A review committee was convened with representation from the City Council, City Engineering, Community Development office, Lumber City Development Corporation, Parks and Recreation, and City Accounting, to review the proposals and provide a recommendation to the Council.

Upon review the committee is recommending the City select the proposal submitted by Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc. Nussbaumer is a local firm with experience engineering design. The review committee felt the team assembled by Nussbaumer demonstrated the experience, creativity, and capacity to complete this project for the City at a reasonable fee.

I am hereby requesting this honorable body consider selecting Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc. to complete the Gateway Park Improvements Project and authorize the Mayor to sign a

contract with Nussbaumer, pending review and approval by the City Attorney, for the proposed fee of \$77,500.00.

Members of the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) met with the Mayor previously to request an administrative assistant be assigned to assist with tasks such as taking meeting minutes, filing the necessary paperwork with the required offices, and providing general support to the Commission.
