Traffic Safety Minutes:

The October 2018 meeting of the North Tonawanda Traffic Safety Committee was called to order at 1900 hours. Roll call showed the following members present: R. Frank, J. Sikora, M. Daigler, A. DiBernardo, D. Grinnell. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and accepted, the following new concerns/requests were discussed, and recommendations made.

- ①. The mayor's office would like a 20-25 mph speed zone on Webster Street between Tremont and Goundry Street due to the volume of traffic in the downtown area. The committee recommends that we make Webster Street from Sweeney to Main Street a 20 MPH speed zone.
2. Alex Domarodski of the North Tonawanda Recreation Department would like a crosswalk and sign in front of the Recreation Department on Vandervoort Street. This was approved back in November 2017 by the committee. Member Daigler will take care of the painting and sign before winter.
- ③. Mark Zellner and Mark Daigler from the DPW requested that the committee look into making Geneva Street a one way street. Member Daigler states that measurements of the street do not allow for a fire truck or plow to go down the street safely if a vehicle is in the street. Daigler has interviewed 7 residents on the street who were in favor of the one way street but all requested to have the one way go from Lincoln Avenue to Vandervoort Street. The rest of the residents were not home. The committee is in favor of the one way street but recommends that the council send letters to every resident on Geneva Street and/or have a public forum. This decision would have to be soon due to the winter coming in the next couple months.
- ④. The committee received letters in regards to placing "No Parking" signs on one of the sides of Weaver Parkway. Member DiBernardo spoke with numerous residents who were in agreement with placing the "No Parking" signs. The committee recommends that the "No Parking" signs go on the north end of the street due to locations of the fire hydrants also being on the north side of the street.

5. The "No Parking" signs on Christiana Street have been taken down by the school except for the two that block the walkway to the building. Those signs were left so that no one blocks the entrance way no matter what the building becomes in the future.

Dear Honorable Body:

On Tuesday, October 16, 2018, proposals were received and publicly opened by the City Clerk. The Department of Public Works reviewed the proposals and tabulated as follows:

<u>Contractor</u>	<u>Alternate # 1</u>	<u>Alternate #2</u>
Buffalo Recycling	\$ 125.00/Ton	\$120.00/Ton less 50% Revenue Share. Current Commodity Value and Contractor proposal would result in \$91.23/Ton
Republic Services	\$ 35.00/Ton	\$90.00/Ton less Revenue Share. Current Commodity Value and Contractor proposal would result in \$35.34/Ton

I recommend the Common Council award the Material Recovery Facility to Republic Services, Alternate #1, who supplied the lowest cost absent of market volatility and presented a qualified quotation. This is subject to the approval of the City Attorney.
