Re: NT Momentum proposed zoning code revisions

Honorable Body;

Since 2005 the City of North Tonawanda, in collaboration with many State and local partners, has committed significant time and resources to strategic and master planning efforts throughout the city. This has included the 2006 Downtown Redevelopment Plan, the 2009 Comprehensive Plan, the 2011 updated to the Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP), the 2012 Brownfield Opportunity Area (BOA) Nomination Study, the 2018 Brownfield Opportunity Area Implementation Strategy, and the 2018 Oliver Street Community Needs Assessment. Beginning in 2005 the City held public meetings, hearing, and plan reviews for each of the planning processes referenced above.

While these plans have helped to establish a new vision for growth and development in the City, one common theme throughout these plans is the incompatibility of some of the City's outdated zoning ordinances and land use policies with that vision for future growth. This need for a zoning revision was identified in the Downtown Redevelopment Plan, Comprehensive Plan, LWRP, and BOA documents.

In 2014, the City was awarded funding through the New York State Department of State (DOS) to complete Step 3 of the Brownfield Opportunity Area program, known as the Implementation phase. Working with Bergmann Associates, the City completed the BOA Implementation Strategy (branded the NT Momentum Plan) which outlined a master redevelopment vision for the downtown and waterfront areas and was approved by this Council in 2018. The Implementation Strategy had a number of tasks and deliverables including drafting zoning revisions for the study area. Because the BOA funding was limited to a defined area, specifically the Niagara River waterfront and historic downtown areas, these zoning revisions were limited to only the districts within the BOA study area and do not address or amend any of the rest of the zoning codes throughout the city.

Beginning in 2015 the City's BOA steering committee directed Bergmann Associates to begin drafting zoning code revisions for the downtown and waterfront areas of the BOA district. Between 2015 and 2018, Bergmann Associates held 15 meetings with the BOA steering committee, 8 meetings with City

2019 007 9 PH2:22 ORTH TO IGNOVO 9 NY staff, and presented 3 progress updates to the Common Council. Two public meeting were held in 2015 at the beginning of the process to allow the public to inform the direction of the pending zoning revisions.

The zoning code revisions completed through the BOA Implementation Strategy were broken into two distinct districts: the Waterfront District and the Downtown District (see enclosed maps). The final draft of these zoning documents were presented and reviewed with the Common Council on March 27, 2018 and with the Planning Board on April 2, 2018.

In compliance with the State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) requirements in order to adopt the BOA Implementation Strategy, the City opened a formal public review period for all the BOA documents including the revised zoning documents in October and November of 2018. Comments were received and the Common Council approved the BOA Implementation Strategy Environmental Impact Statement in January 2019. The full copies of the proposed zoning revisions, along with all other BOA documents, have been available for review in the Community Development office and online at www.ntmomentum.com since October 2018.

At the guidance of the City Attorney, an additional public hearing specific to the adoption of the revised zoning codes was held August 27, 2019 and an additional 20-day public comment period granted. The City received one submitted public comment during the comment period but it was not relevant to the substance of the proposed Downtown and Waterfront zoning code revisions.




I'm writing you to respectfully request that the Common Council hear/discuss my family's recent issue with our water bill (described below). I appreciate any consideration you and the entire Council can give to this matter.

Upon receiving my last water bill, I was shocked to find that it was nearly 23 times our normal water bill. The \$1,029.30 bill immediately made us search the house looking for any possible leaks or issues regarding the integrity of our household plumbing system. We discovered a failure of our primary sump pump (please see the photo in Attachment 1). Fortunately, or unfortunately in this case, we have a water assisted backup sump pump that kicked-in to assist. Due to the extreme volume of rain we had, our backup sump pump was apparently running non-stop. To compound matters, we did not see or hear the pump discharge which is located next to our patio (Photo in Attachment 2). Typically, we could notice the discharge and be alerted that there was a problem but due to the extensive amount of rainy days, we were rarely on our patio.

I completely agree and understand that I used the water recorded by our meter. We have since replaced our sump pump and also added an alarm (Photo in Attachment 3) to notify us if/when the backup sump pump turns on via a sensor in the backup pump discharge line referenced above. I am asking for relief from the sewer charges that are in excess of our normal bill, as this discharge simply goes into our yard, and not into the City treatment system as evidenced in the photo referenced above. Please consider refunding the sewer fees in excess of our base sewer rate, \$514.50, the "Sewer Penalty," \$12.30, and the late fee, \$90.15, for a total of \$616.95. We did call the water department several times to inquire about the bill prior to the bill due date (which took me several tries to reach someone during the listed work hours). Once we did get a response, I was told I couldn't get any help (after a suggestion that I probably used the water to fill my pool, of which I don't own). Being unsatisfied with the response, we called again and were again told that we couldn't be helped and to write to the Common Council. We were trying to get to the bottom of the situation before the bill's due date, and unaware of the time required to hear a response from the Council, we ultimately decided to pay the entire \$1,1119.45 bill including late fee, before further fees were were imposed. Therefore, I'm asking for a refund of a bill already paid as opposed to "relief" from a pending bill.

My family has been lifelong residents of the City, has invested time and money into our property, and have been an advocates for improving the City. I have not filed any previous complaints/requests prior to this and hope you will consider this request. I am also including a copy of the Water Bill in question as well as my account information.


