



1. In accordance with the Mayor's authority under Section 2.023 of our City Charter, I wish to exercise my veto on the Council's Approved 2025 Budget Amendments pertaining to the Parks and Recreation Department reflected in the attachment.

Please review the attached proposal from our Director of Youth, Recreation, Parks & Seniors, Alex Domaradzki. This revised plan still aligns with the Council's directive to reduce the department's budget by \$34,000 and properly allocates funds. The adjustments are informed by his professional experience and are designed to minimize the need for significant budget transfers at the end of 2025.

Firstly I want to commend everyone for working on the budget for the 2025 season. The Mayor's office in coordination with the Accounting Office has done an exceptional job of working with each department head to accommodate our needs and trusting our expertise to make difficult decisions on scaling back and cutting expenses. I am disappointed to see that the hard work that went into the Mayor's proposed budget has been altered with additional cuts to our department.

I understand the desire for the council to propose additional cuts in attempt to create less tax burden on our citizens, and I appreciate the Council reaching out to include my consultation on further department cuts; however I am very disappointed to the amendments to the budget which ignored my suggestions completely.

Amendment #10: \$15,000 reduction in Golf Course Seasonal Staffing. This was never a proposed cut by my department. 4 of the past 5 years we have gone over our seasonal staffing budget for the golf course because we simply cannot ignore work that needs to be done, nor can we understaff to an extent that is a detriment to the course and our operations. The results of such a large cut in staffing would result in 967 hours of lost staffing (equating to the reduction in approximately one operational shift each day). That's not feasible and in my professional opinion very questionable at best, when our golf course is thriving and serves as a large source of revenue for the City. The expectation to increase fees (to generate more revenue) and to contrastingly decrease the amount of resources we are putting into the course is not a wise combination and needs to be reconsidered. To date you have been very supportive of your investment in the golf course, and we have seen the returns on that investment in revenue well exceeding our projections, especially for this past 2024 golfing season.

Amendment # 9: \$8,000 reduction in Parks Seasonal Staffing. This was almost double the proposed cut suggested by my office when your team reached out with a desire to further cut the proposed Mayor's budget. This cut represents a loss of 516 hours of lost labor (equating to two summer help staff-responsible for a variety of duties including garbage pick-up, park clean up, weeding & planting flower beds, weed whacking etc).

It is my recommendation that you consider my suggestions below which still hold to the \$34,000 in suggested department cuts; dispersing these cuts in the following manner listed below. Furthermore, please note that increasing the projected revenues as per the amendments you provided will result in a change to the originally proposed fee schedule that our department's revenue projections for 2025 were based off. An amended fee schedule is attached.

AGREEMENT

Agreement is hereby made between the City of North Tonawanda with a business address at City Hall, 216 Payne Avenue, North Tonawanda, New York 14120, hereafter referred to as Client, and Ms. Diane Sheehan with a business address at 142 Vine Street, Lockport, New York 14094, hereafter referred to as Independent Contractor, set forth below according to the following terms, conditions and provisions:

The Independent Contractor certifies that she is established in an independent business offering services to the public and has obtained a Certificate of Business effective January 1, 1998.

The Independent Contractor has significantly invested in facilities and/or equipment to adequately provide its services to the public and is free to provide such services concurrently to other clients or businesses.

The Independent Contractor assumes all risk for profit or loss in providing services to the client and is free to establish the hours of work and schedule of activities under this agreement without control or stipulations by the client.

The Independent Contractor will function without the direct supervision of the client and will provide all facilities, equipment and supplies for the performance of the services under this agreement.

The Independent Contractor, under the terms of this agreement, will provide the following services to the client:

1. To conduct the Youth Court Program on an ongoing basis which will hold court at least once per month.
2. To recruit new agencies which are willing to supervise youth who are required to complete community service hours.
3. To conduct recruiting and training for youth interested in becoming Youth Court officials.
4. To conduct the First Offender Program on an ongoing basis.
5. To divert 20 offenders between the ages of 12-21 from the criminal justice system. The groups will consist of no more than 20 youth per group.

The Independent Contractor will receive from the client the amount of \$18,831.96 (eighteen thousand eight hundred and thirty one dollars and ninety six cents) for the satisfactory delivery of the services specified in the above paragraph. This amount will be paid in a monthly amount of \$1569.33 (one thousand five hundred and sixty nine dollars and thirty three cents) per month.

The Client shall not be liable to the Independent Contractor for any expenses paid or incurred by the Independent Contractor beyond the stipulations of this agreement unless otherwise agreed in writing.

The Independent Contractor shall supply, at Independent Contractor's sole expense, all equipment, materials and/or supplies to provide the service here-to-fore agreed.

Neither federal, nor state, nor local income tax nor payroll tax of any kind shall be withheld or paid by CLIENT on behalf of the Independent Contractor or the employees of the Independent Contractor.

Because the Independent Contractor is engaged in her own independent business, the Independent Contractor is not eligible for, and shall not participate in, any employer pension, health or other fringe benefit plan of the CLIENT.

The Independent Contractor understands that she is responsible to pay, according to federal and state law, the Independent Contractor's income taxes. The Independent Contractor further understands that she may be liable for self-employment (Social Security) tax, to be paid by the Independent Contractor according to law.

No workers' compensation insurance shall be obtained by the CLIENT concerning the Independent Contractor or the employees of the Independent Contractor. The Independent Contractor shall comply with the workers' compensation law concerning the Independent Contractor and the employees of the Independent Contractor.

Without cause, either party may terminate this agreement after giving 30 days written notice to the other of intent to terminate without cause. The parties shall deal with each other in good faith during the 30 day period after any notice of intent to terminate without cause has been given.

With reasonable cause, either party may terminate this agreement effective immediately upon giving of written notice of termination for cause. Reasonable cause shall include:

1. Material violation of this agreement.
2. Any act exposing the other party to liability to others for personal injury or property damage.

The failure of either party to exercise any of its rights under this agreement for breach thereof shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such rights or a waiver of any subsequent breach.

The Independent Contractor has no authority to enter into contracts or agreements on half of the CLIENT. This agreement does not create a partnership between the Independent Contractor and the CLIENT.

The Independent Contractor declares that she has complied with all federal, state and local laws regarding business permits and licenses that may be required to carry out the work to be performed under this agreement.

Any notice given in connection with this agreement shall be given in writing and shall be delivered either by hand to the party or by certified mail, return receipt required, to the party at the party's address stated herein. Any party may change its business address stated herein by giving notice of the change in accordance with this paragraph.

Any dispute under this agreement or related to this agreement shall be decided in accordance with the laws of the State of New York.

This is the entire agreement of the parties and cannot be changed or modified orally.

If any part of this agreement shall be held unenforceable, the rest of this agreement will nevertheless remain in full force and effect.

This agreement may be supplemented, amended or revised only in writing by agreement of the parties.

This Agreement shall become effective at:

12:00 A.M. on January 1, 2025 and shall terminate at 11:59 P.M. on December 31, 2025

Attached is the updated proposed program fee schedule for 2025, based on revenue amendments voted on by the council. Our budgeted revenue for 2025 is based off this following schedule which sees increases to youth sports, adult team sports, pavilion rentals, boat launch permits and golf fees (all fees highlighted in yellow are reflective of an increase compared to 2024).

These fee increases will help to offset the increase costs of providing services with an anticipated \$101,284.00 in personnel costs from last year, simply due to contractual raises and upgrades per CSEA and OPEIU unions as well as the minimum wage increase which takes affect in 2025.

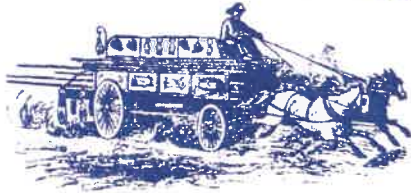
